FeNZ Coach Registration

GENERAL GUIDELINES

There are two stages to accrediting as a coach recognised by Fencing New Zealand: Registration as an active coach, and Accreditation to a given level of technical expertise.

As a minimum, all coaches coaching at FeNZ affiliated clubs or events are expected to be Registered.

Applicants must be aged at least 16 years at the time of application.

Candidates for registration should email their application to coaching@fencing.org.nz, with documents supporting the criteria below attached.

COACHING REGISTRATION CRITERIA

FENZ MEMBERSHIP

Candidates must be currently affiliated financial members of Fencing New Zealand (Associate Membership as a minimum) to apply for, and maintain, registration.

COMPLETE A PRACTICAL FIRST AID COURSE

Candidates must hold a St John, Red Cross, or similar NZQA approved (unit standards 6401, 6402) workplace first aid certificate.

FENZ COACHES' CODE OF CONDUCT AND HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

Candidates must agree to, sign, scan and return the signing page of the Fencing New Zealand Coach Code of Conduct by email to coaching@fencing.org.nz.

Candidates must be familiar with the Fencing New Zealand Health and Safety Policy and apply it to their coaching practice.

UNDERGO A NZ POLICE CHECK

All candidates must consent to undergo a New Zealand Police check by filling out the Applicant Sections (Sections 2 and 3) of the Request and Consent Form found at <http://www.police.govt.nz/advice/businesses-and-organisations/vetting/forms-and-guides>, signing and forwarding it to coaching@fencing.org.nz who will then register the forms via the FeNZ police check agent.
