



National U15 and Cadet Championship

Fencing New Zealand and Fencing Central invite you to attend the 2021 New Zealand National Under 15 and Cadet Championships

Key Information

Date: Saturday 24th April 2021 to Monday 26th April 2021

Venue: [Upper Gym, Wellington High School, Taranaki Street, Wellington](#)

Eligibility: The U15 competition is open to all fencers who were under 15 years of age on 1st January 2021.
The Cadet competition is open to all fencers who were under 17 years of age on 1st January 2021.
Fencers must be at least 11 years old on the day of the event - refer to the FeNZ Minimum Age Policy.

Affiliations

Please note that all competitors must be affiliated members of Fencing New Zealand or if you are an overseas competitor you must be affiliated to your national body. Go to dev.fencing.org.nz to affiliate with your relevant region. Affiliations of all competitors will be checked at time of entry.

Competition Format

All events will be a round of Pools followed by Direct Elimination round.

Under 15 and Cadet Sabre are combined. Men's and Women's Sabre will be fenced separately. U15 Men's and Women's Épée will be fenced separately.

Multiple discipline entry: If you are entered in multiple disciplines and the next discipline is scheduled to begin while you are still competing, you will be scratched from the then starting discipline and expected to continue competing in the ongoing discipline. No refunds will be provided.

Medals: Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd equal placings. For U15 & Cadet Sabre which will be fenced together medals will be given as follows:

- U15 gold to the highest ranked U15 fencer, U15 silver to the second highest ranked U15 fencer, U15 bronze to the third & fourth highest ranked fencer.
- Cadet gold to the highest ranked Cadet fencer, Cadet silver to the second highest ranked Cadet fencer, Cadet bronze to the third & fourth highest ranked fencer. In the event two fencers are eliminated in the same round then the gold & silver medal will be decided by a DE bout to determine who will win the gold medal.

Trophies: The national U15 and Cadet trophies will also be awarded.

Non-combativity: FIE rule t.124, non-combativity will be implemented at this competition.

Podium protocol: All fencers must wear either their club jacket, regional or FeNZ tracksuit jacket, breeches or tracksuit pants, fencing socks and shoes while on podium. No hats, sunglasses or other similar attire are to be worn on the podium during presentation.

Video refereeing: The use of video refereeing is yet to be determined. If used, video referees will be used for the final bout of all events. In all cases, it will be used at the discretion of the Head DT and Head Referee. Video footage will be used purely to review decisions and will not be released post competition.

Competition Fees

First event: \$60.00

Additional events: \$30.00 for each additional event (maximum \$210.00 for six events)

Late entry fee: \$50.00 for entries received after 10:00pm Saturday 10th April.

Payment can be made by direct deposit to 02-0500-0025212-00. Please reference as fencer's name and "CADET21". Please ensure that the amount paid is accurate and includes late fees if applicable. Payment is required in advance, and cheques and cash will not be accepted at the venue.

Entries due: 10:00pm Saturday 10th April. Late entries close Friday 16th April and will attract a \$50 late fee. Entries received after Friday 16th April are at discretion of the Head DT and Head Referee.

Equipment Standards

All clothing and equipment must be in a good state of repair and cleanliness.

Torso:	350N (CEN 1) or 800N (CEN 2) (jacket & plastron 1150N total)
Breeches:	350N (CEN 1)
Gloves:	800 N (CEN 1) (sabre only)
Chest protector:	Compulsory for women's events.
Foil:	Lamé bibs (curly mask wires are not permitted) and FIE blades required, Bayonet and 2 pin body wires accepted. FIE no. 3 size blades are acceptable.
Épée:	FIE blades required. Leon Paul SR-71 blades that are stamped 2013 to 2015 will not be accepted. Leon Paul V blade without a unique serial number will not be accepted.
Sabre:	FIE blades S2000 or later blades required. Curly mask wires are not permitted.
Masks & Bibs:	350N (CEN 1)
All masks must fit well and be in good condition. The elastic strap shall be in good working order with elasticity and be able return to its original position after stretching, without deformation. The hook and loop securing the elastic shall be capable of retaining the elastic and resisting removal. Leon Paul X-Change masks must have a secondary strap/bar. Visor masks are strictly prohibited for all 3 weapons	

Weapons control: Open on Friday 23rd April 6:00pm to 9:00pm. Weapons control is also open for one hour before the start of each event.

Control marks: It is the fencer's responsibility to ensure that all equipment that goes through weapons control has control marks. It is the fencer's responsibility to ensure control marks are still present every time they go to the piste.

COVID-19 Protocols

While there is a risk of COVID-19 in the community and New Zealand is at Alert Level one or higher the following additional rules and protocols will be followed:

- Fencers, coaches, officials, and spectators who are sick or have any Covid symptoms should withdraw from the competition and stay away from the venue.
- The DT has the right to refuse entry to a competitor, coach, official or spectator who is showing signs of being unwell. This will be determined by a medically trained officer who will administer a temperature check. If the result comes back over 38C+ they shall be removed from the competition.
- Fencers' equipment & whites must be clean and recently washed.
- Fencers will be provided with a box for their equipment to be left at weapons control to be checked.
- There is to be no sharing of fencing equipment or water bottles.
- Please sign in with the government Covid Tracer App when you enter the venue.
- The change to rule t.122 will apply. Fencers will not shake hands of their opponent or the referee on the piste but will salute instead.
- There is to be no hugging or kissing at the conclusion of both individual or team bouts.
- Spare weapons/ body wires need to be kept either in a piste bag or neatly at the end of the piste. They need to be removed by the fencer at the end of each bout.
- Hand sanitiser will be at each piste for use before fencers start poules & DE rounds.
- QR codes will be posted around the venue that will link fencers to the live competition results. Results will not be posted in one location within the venue, as we wish to minimise large congregation of fencers/ coaches and spectators.
- If there is an alert level change in Wellington, guidelines will be issued to all registered fencers with any updates regarding venue, spectators or any additional protocol that will be put into place.

Competition Entry

Entry conditions: By registering as a participant in this tournament, you are agreeing to abide by the rules of fencing as set out by the FIE, OFC, Fencing New Zealand, and any directions given by the organisers in relation to the running of the tournament. You agree that you fence at your own risk, and that should emergency medical care need be sought, that this is at your own expense in the event of sudden accident or illness. You agree to abide by all applicable Fencing New Zealand rules including the FeNZ Health and Safety Policy and the Fencers Code of Conduct.

Anti-doping: By participating in this event, you agree that you have been warned of the potential of being selected for anti-doping testing and you will comply with anti-doping testing if required. The testing process and your rights and responsibilities as an athlete are outlined in the [Drug Free Sport NZ website](#).

COVID-19 agreement: I understand that Fencing NZ and Fencing Central continue to monitor the overseas and local COVID-19 situation. I agree that if I have recently travelled from overseas or been in close contact with anyone who has travelled from overseas or tested positive for COVID-19 that I will refrain from fencing at this competition or other competitions for 14 days.

Wellbeing agreement: I agree to withdraw from this competition if I am feeling unwell on the day of the competition. I agree to submit to having my temperature checked by the medical officer if the DT requires. If my temperature is taken and it is 38C or higher I agree to withdraw from the competition and leave the venue.

Photography: I understand that photographs may be taken at the event, including competitors, officials, and spectators. I agree that photos taken at the venue may be used by Fencing Central and Fencing New Zealand for promotional purposes, including posting on official social media channels.

Withdrawals: In the event that you must withdraw from the competition or an event, you must notify the tournament organiser or Head DT either by emailing tournaments@fencingcentral.org.nz or calling (+64)27-229-6102 a minimum of one hour before registrations for the event open.
